

Forest North Drainage Improvement Project August 2017



Dear Neighbor,

You are receiving this email because you signed up for regular updates on the Forest North Drainage Improvement Project, or you are located within a zone where construction work is taking place or is soon to begin.

DeNucci Constructors, LLC completed storm pipe installation and began concrete driveway construction in the Wisterwood Zone. They completed concrete driveway construction and completed final ditch grading for permanent seeding in the Stillforest Zone. In the Briar Hollow Zone, they began storm pipe installation. Asphalt trench repairs began in Braeburn Glenn Zone. DeNucci Constructors, LLC will continue concrete driveway and sidewalk construction in Wisterwood Zone, and will complete permanent seeding and installation of erosion control blankets in the Stillforest Zone. They will complete trench repairs in the Braeburn Glen Zone, and continue storm pipe installation in the Briar Hollow Zone. They will also begin asphalt trench repairs in Wisterwood Zone.

There will be intermittent lane/road closures on Moorberry, Woodthorpe and Broadmeade in the Braeburn Zone and intermittent lane/road closures on Braeburn Glen Street and Briar Hollow Drive in the Briar Hollow Zone. There will be intermittent lane/road closures on Kensington Street, Broadmeade Avenue and Braeburn Glen Street in the Wisterwood Zone.

The Braeburn (blue), Briar Hollow (orange), Stillforest (yellow) and Wisterwood (green) zones are highlighted in the image below. A larger map of the neighborhood and the work zones may be found [here](#).



Members of the construction team have made or will make door-to-door visits prior to actual construction in each zone. Vehicles parked on the street may need to be relocated while work occurs. Please continue to visit the [project website](#) for updates.

Wisterwood and Briar Hollow zone Residents:

Residents in the construction area have received notifications about the project and a door hanger regarding homeowner items in the right-of-way. If you wish to preserve these items (custom mailboxes, landscaping, planters, trees, irrigation systems, etc.), it is suggested you begin removing them now from the right-of-way. If homeowner items are not removed by the time construction begins, then the contractor will consider these items left for refuse.

Mailboxes: Mailboxes in the path of drainage work will be removed and replaced with standard units. We are in close communication with the post office to ensure there is no disruption of mail service.

Driveways: The regrading of channels and replacement of driveway culverts will require the reconstruction of some driveways. Driveways will be accessible by the end of each workday. Full driveway repairs will be made upon completion of the entirety of the work at each property. Notice will be provided to homeowners and residents at least 48 hours prior to any driveway access interruptions.

Irrigation Systems: Irrigation systems in the path of drainage work will be removed, capped at the right-of-way line and will not be replaced.
